

HMS Victory

Possibly Britain's most famous warship, HMS Victory was floated out of Chatham's Royal Dockyard on 7 May 1765. She led fleets in the American War of Independence, the French Revolutionary War and the Napoleonic War.

Then in 1805 she achieved lasting fame as the flagship of Vice-Admiral Nelson in Britain's greatest naval victory, the defeat of the French and Spanish at the Battle of Trafalgar.

In 1922 she was saved for the nation and placed permanently into dry dock where she remains today as the oldest commissioned warship in the world.

You can discover HMS Victory along with other ships including the Mary Rose at Portsmouth's Historic dockyard, located next to Gunwharf Quays. You can also discover more at the Submarine Museum in Gosport by catching the ferry and then hopping on one of our **Eclipse E1 or E2** services. The South Stand dates back to 1925 and was originally designed by Archibal Leitch who also designed a number of stands and grounds during this period. The other three stands are the North Stand, Fratton End and Milton End. Outside on one corner of the South Stand is the unique and eye-catching mock tudor facade.

The D-Day Story

The D-Day Story starts with a visit to the impressive 59 metre Landing Craft Tank 7074, one of the last surviving examples from D-Day which sits proudly outside the museum. Inside the main museum, The D-Day Story uses authentic objects, interactives and video to tell the story of D-Day from the preparation and build up, to the landings and the Battle of Normandy. The stunning 83 metre Overlord Embroidery offers a fantastic finale to your visit.
