## St Ives

Surrounded by gorgeous beaches, this pretty town arcs around the harbour with fishing boats bobbing in the sea.

There are trips round the bay to take, or wander around the historic web of cobbled streets to discover charming independent shops, interesting galleries, and great cafés and restaurants, whether you want a quick cappuccino or nice meal.

Artists have flocked to St Ives for many years and it still has a buzzing creative scene. Take a look at the famous Leach Pottery, founded in 1920, which has contemporary exhibitions, as well as pottery for sale.

And don't forget the sandy beaches with sparkling seawater ideal for swimming, -sunbathing and, of course, building sandcastles!



## Tate St Ives

With stunning views over the Atlantic Ocean, this gallery showcases works by the St Ives Modernists like Barbara Hepworth and Ben Nicholson, alongside an ever-changing programme of thought-provoking exhibitions.



## Hayle Towans

This fantastic 3-mile stretch of broad sandy beach and dunes sweeps north-east from the Hayle estuary to Gwithian, popular with surfers, sand yachts and kite buggies. Towans is Cornish for dunes.



## Atlantic coast walks

A walk over coastal grasslands, along the cliffs or over the sand is a surefire way of blowing away the cobwebs and getting some fresh sea air in your lungs.

At the far end of St Ives Bay is Godrevy's awe-inspiring expanse of sandy beach and the wildlife rich headlands and the dramatic coves of the North Cliffs and Western Hill.

And with the Sunseeker, you don't have to retrace your steps - just catch the bus back further along.



## Gwithian

The beach beyond the broad sand dunes is a favourite with surfers.

Common seals are a regular sight and the area is a breeding ground for guillemots, razorbills and cormorants. At low tide, rock pools and caves are uncovered, great for kids.

Perched above the dunes, Sunset Surf Café serves delicious home-cooked meals packed with locally-sourced ingredients.

Further along, the Jam Pot Café and Shop, a former 19th-century coastguard lookout with sweeping views across St Ives Bay, serves freshly prepared snacks.

Use the Sunseekers to get you into St Ives or Newquay, or to any of the fabulous beaches shown in this leaflet - and remember, your ticket lasts all day, so you can go on somewhere else later.

## Newquay

The surfing capital of Cornwall has a decidedly boho vibe, and it's fun to watch the surfers ride the waves as they come rolling in off the Atlantic. During surfing festivals, Fistral Beach becomes the centre of the world for many, but family-friendly Newquay has plenty of other attractions to occupy everyone.

Discover Newquay's evolution from fishing port to surf mecca on the town trail, take a boat ride out to sea, browse the eclectic range of shops or get up close to a vast array of marine life at Blue Reef Aquarium.

## Perranporth

Discover one of Cornwall's most spectacular beaches (see below), where miles of soft, golden sand stretch far into the distance while huge white-crested waves roll in from the Atlantic. The extensive sand dunes are home to birds and butterflies and tiny sunbathing lizards.

The busy town has plenty of places serving up traditional Cornish food, along with many cafés and bars catering for the beach crowd.



## Holywell Bay

Enjoy the broad sweep of golden sands of this beautiful bay with the spectacular Gulls Rocks standing sentinel, as you can see on the right.

At low tide you can explore the grotto-like Holywell Cave with its calcium deposits, but don't get cut off by the tide. The wreck of an old Argentinian coaster can also be seen just offshore at low tide.



## Crantock Beach

Here by the estuary of the Gannel River you'll find a large expanse of dunes and a golden sandy beach, popular for swimming, snorkelling, surfing and wind-surfing. with board/canoe hire on the beach. Dolphins occasionally visit too!

It's owned and looked after by the National Trust and as well as cafés and toilets there are places to hire boards and canoes.
